CONCERTS AT ST JAMES

Casualties of War To mark the Centenary of Armistice Day, Richard Roddis and friends present a commemorative programme of songs and readings. Rather than focussing on the conflict, this recital highlights the talent of the British composers and poets who like so many others left to fight but never returned. It also celebrates the rural landscape of England which they held so dear and which they died defending.

Composers: George Butterworth, Gerald Finzi, W Denis Browne and Ernest Farrar. Poets: Edward Thomas, Rupert Brooke, Wilfred Owen, Francis Ledwidge. Plus straddling the two art-forms Ivor Gurney who survived.

Appassionato - A Recital of Music for Violin and Piano Amalia Young and Bryan Evans will present a recital of classical music for violin and piano on Sunday 18 November at 2.30pm. Amalia is a former member of the Choir of St James the Greater and is now studying at the Royal Academy of Music in London. Music includes Francis Poulenc's Violin Sonata, J.S.
